WEB SITE REVIEW by Lowell Benson.

This is the eighteenth in the Article-for-the-Month review series for Club members who don't have immediate internet access. In September 2010 we posted "CP-823/U communications reveals discovery of an intact 1963 computer." A CP-823 was contracted by the Naval Air Development Center (NADC) in 1964 for 30-bit Anti-Submarine Warfare software development. This Univac 1830, CP-823/U was donated to Drexel University in Pennsylvania around 1970. Drexel put it into storage about 1973. A graduate student there rescued the computer and development documentation from a dumpster as Drexel was cleaning house in the winter of 2010. Mr. Todd J. Thomas bought the 'scrap' system in the spring of 2010. He contacted us 7/2010 after finding a tidbit about the CP-823/U computer on the VIP Club web site. The article chronicles the emails as we dug deep CP-823/U SERIAL A1 COMPUTING SYSTEM, A-NEW MOD 3 (UNIVAC 1830). MEDICARE ENROLLMENT

Our Medicare enrollment period starts October 15 and ends December 7. You should have received the 2012 Medicare & You handbook from the government. The handbook summarizes 35 health plans, 14 special needs plans, and 33 prescription drug plans. (The 80 plus plans are almost half of the 140 plus plans available last year.)

The Minnesota Board on Aging has the Health Care Choices 2012 booklet available online at <u>www.mnaging.org</u>; a printed copy can be request through the Senior LinkAge Line (1-800-333-2433). The Senior LinkAge Line is also the resource for help comparing Medicare Part D and Medicare Advantage plans and determining if you qualify for extra help with costs through the special needs plans for low income enrollees. As usual, for those with numerous and costly medicines, the more complicated part is determining which plan has the better formulary and smaller deductibles and copays.

Both HealthPartners and UCare have plan packages with good information and a range of prices. Additional help is in the November 2011 Consumer Reports, with plan rankings for both Medicare and non-Medicare health plans, a timeline for Affordable Care Act plan changes, and how-tochoose suggestions.

Directions to Unisys MACS Bldg. in Eagan. Take Hwy 35E south or north to Pilot Knob Road. Turn left (north) on Pilot Knob Road. Turn left on Tower View Road. The Unisys MACS Bldg. is at 3199 Pilot Knob Road.

Directions to Unisys in Roseville. Take Hwy 35W south, or north, to the Industrial Way / St. Anthony Blvd off ramp. If coming north or south on Hwy 35E go west on Hwy 36 which will take you to the Industrial Way / St. Anthony Blvd. off ramp of 35W (Hwy 36 becomes Hwy 35W where it joins Hwy 35W). Go north on St. Anthony Blvd. to Walnut St. (the first street on the right). Turn right and go to Walnut Street. It is the first place where you can turn left. Then turn left onto Terminal Road. Then turn right at Highcrest Rd. to building entrance. From Hwy 280 northbound, use left lane exit just past Cty Rd B for Terminal road access (St Croix St.). Turn left at Terminal Rd, then turn right at Highcrest Rd to building entrance."
