PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

'Twas a great day! Of course, I am referring to the VIP Club's 40th Anniversary celebration, which actually took place 41 years after the real founding date. You all know why this was delayed, and this time



I refuse to acknowledge that about which the rest of the world is still worried. My high school English teacher would like that sentence, but it still seems a bit oldfashioned.

It was great because a lot of you from different work generations got together to celebrate corporate and club longevity, renew old acquaintances and just enjoy a social get-together that has been so rare in recent times.

The history of the VIP Club is remarkable. Back then, Millie Gignac, a St. Paul Human Resources employee fresh back from a stint in Blue Bell, wanted to find a way for retirees to continue their work relationships after retirement. She proposed and spearheaded the company sponsorship of a retiree group, which became federally registered as an independent 503(c)(7) organization.

Think back to the context of 1980. An actor by the name of Reagan was elected President, Mt. St. Helens erupted and the Olympic games in Moscow were boycotted. Big headlines were Abscam, Cuban refugees, John Lennon's murder and surging inflation. Early 1980 also saw the Miracle on Ice: the U.S. hockey team winning Olympic Gold, the launch of CNN and Post-it Notes. Oddly, when I look at the stories on our website (http://vipclubmn.org/Legacy.html), I don't find many stories about our company from 1980 (more later).

Millie, the first female to be promoted to a director level job, was quite a leader. Her retiree club initiative continues to today, and everyone who was there for our 40th (41st) Anniversary party, and even those unable to attend, should stop and give thanks to her vision.

And speaking of thanks, a couple of big shout-out "Thank You!" recognitions are due.

First, thanks to Keith Myhre, the leader of our legacy archiving crew, for his work in editing and pulling together the videos we screened at the party. Lots of material to choose from, a big effort to pull it all together and a completely enjoyable result.

Second, but far from last, an enormous "Thank You" to Keith Behnke. Keith led the effort to pull this gathering off, starting in 2019 when we were targeting a 2020 event. He did all the leg work to find a place and structure the gathering, only to have it overcome by events—events that had no predictable outcome making it pretty hard to make plans. Keith kept following up with possible options and plan revisions to deal with all the evolving circumstances. I'm guessing Keith reconfigured this event about half a dozen times, with the final result that finally happened in September of 2021. Thanks, Keith! It wouldn't have been a success without your dedication and leadership.

Back to 1980. When I went to our website, the dearth of stories and references to the era of the 1980's was a pretty big surprise. I recall many interesting projects and events happening in the 1980's, yet not too many people have taken the effort to document them. You all have heard my previous pleas to get our history documented. 'Nuff said.
