IT Legacy Project, since 2005

- Goal: Engineering Research Associates (ERA) began a remarkable story of technological innovation and contributions to the computer industry in 1946. We aim to relate this 77-year+ story as many of us have lived parts of it—most history book entries have limited defense industry information among the commercial computer system development stories.
- **Objectives:** First, is to **capture** whatever remaining material and information available; Second is to **catalog and archive** all the material collected; and Third is to **publish/publicize** our history and heritage in ways that interest industry and our fellow Minnesotans via the web and local institutions.
- Accomplishments: 1) Over 400 people have contributed to our Legacy Anthology, www/vipclubmn.org/Legacy.html. 2) Provided info for Dr. Tom Misa's *Digital State* book. 3) Established an exhibit at the Lawshe Memorial Museum. 4) In 2017 helped move 1100 series shadowboxes to Unisys, Eagan. 5) Supported an ERA memorial plaque commemoration at 1902 Minnehaha Ave. W. in St. Paul.
